An international research organization, the UNEP, warned already in 2016 of the increased risks of pandemics due to biodiversity loss and ecological disruptions. The same is true for the climate crisis: for over 40 years scientists have been warning about the dangers of over-exploiting the Earth, but society as a whole has not responded adequately. It is therefore more important than ever to maintain and promote an engaged form of scientific inquiry, advocating approaches that can respond quickly and rigorously to the societal
