# The Elephant in the Lecture Hall

On March 20<sup>th</sup>, Radboud University organized the ceremony for the education awards. Two members of S4F Radboud were nominated and decided to take this occasion to raise important issues related to education, by teaming up with other local organisations and unions focusing on working conditions in universities and recognition and rewards. Overall, even if of course the nominations were appreciated, we also felt that it was problematic for several reasons:

(1) individual awards are not the way to go to reduce competition and pressure in academia, especially if we are serious about recognition and rewards,

(2) it is rewarding individuals and silencing others when these individual awards are in reality never about one person, and

(3) it is used to advertise practices that are far from reflecting the entire culture of the university (green and social washing), and

(4) it is hiding many problems in terms of inequalities and contracts.

As members of S4F and SR, we focused on the <u>Elephant in the Lecture Hall</u> campaign, advocating for mandatory climate education in universities. We were able to distribute flyers to important decision-makers at Radboud in a friendly atmosphere, and have some of our messages displayed and discussed, even briefly unfortunately, during the ceremony!
