For the coming election and subsequent coalition formation process, Scientists for Future is calling on party leaders to prioritize **a fair and just tackling of the global climate crisis** and to publicly state that, as a party or coalition of parties there will be:

- no new fossil infrastructure and no new gas extraction from the North Sea and below the Wadden Sea;
- an immediate end to the annual 40-46 billion euro fossil subsidies to large polluters in The Netherlands.

We want to make a strong statement from Dutch academia and are asking you for your support to our letter, that you can **find and sign here**. We also ask you to **share our letter with your academic network**, including colleagues in research institutes, in The Netherlands.

As the elections are approaching quickly, the deadline for signing is **Monday 20 October 20:00h**. On Tuesday 21 October we will send the letter with the list of supporting academics and researchers to the political party leaders.


