Greenpeace, Milieudefensie (Friends of the Earth Netherlands), Natuur & Milieu, the Dutch Natuur en Milieu Federaties and other Dutch environmental organisations are currently joining forces in a manifesto "Door met Duurzaam" (Accelerate the sustainable path).

This manifesto emphasizes that the effects of climate change no longer allow us to postpone the energy transition or hide behind nuclear energy – a path that is too slow, much more expensive, and therefore far less sustainable than solar and wind in combination with storage and international grid connectivity.
